



TSJCL Statement on Online Etiquette and Behavioral Guidelines

May 28, 2020

Salvēte omnēs,

It has come to the attention of the State Chairs that students have participated in an inappropriate manner in JCL and related virtual events. This misuse of technology is harmful to the Junior Classical League community.

Unacceptable virtual behaviors include, but are not limited to: lewd or inappropriate language in chat rooms and other communications (Zoom, Discord, Google Meet, etc), offensive usernames, impersonating someone else, as well as cheating and breaking academic honor codes during virtual events. Furthermore, the TSJCL does not condone student participation in other state's virtual events and contests. **Behaviors such as these will not be tolerated by the TSJCL and will result in a loss of privileges and being prohibited from participating in future events.**

We want our students to learn from their mistakes so they do not repeat them, and to accept responsibility for their behavior. We also want them to understand that wrong actions lead to serious consequences; therefore, they must think before they act, post, or comment.

Students are expected to abide by the generally accepted rules of network etiquette and represent our community well. All members of the TSJCL community should be aware of and act on all negative conduct that could impair the quality of the TSJCL Community, are detrimental to the organization's reputation, or endangers others as determined by the TSJCL State Chairs.
